## Subsidy for the Atlantic Recreation and Facilities Conference and Trade Show is Now Available

**HALIFAX, NS** - In partnership, Recreation Nova Scotia (RNS) and the Recreation Facility Association of Nova Scotia (RFANS) are pleased to announce that funding has been received from the Province of Nova Scotia's Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage, for professional development of recreational practitioners from across the province.

'Adapt and Elevate' is the 2024 Atlantic Recreation and Facilities Conference theme. Recreation Prince Edward Island, Recreation Nova Scotia, Recreation Facility Association of Nova Scotia, Recreation New Brunswick and Recreation Newfoundland and Labrador are partnering to offer the fifth edition of this biannual event on May 29-31, 2024, in Fredericton, NB.
